Introduction



Introduction

- To support the transition to CalAIM, Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) intends to offer "on the ground" partners PATH funding for:
 - Technical Assistance (TA)
 - Collaborative Planning and Implementation (CPI)
 - Capacity and Infrastructure; Transition, Expansion and Development (CITED)
- Funding is largely intended to support new activities, infrastructure and programming
- Potential overlap with the HHIP
- While entities may "braid" funding from multiple sources, requests are intended to be complementary and non-duplicative

Introduction (cont.)

- DHCS will appoint a third party to administer programs
- CalOptima's CalAIM project and organizational leaders and Community Relations teams will:
 - Partner with social service agencies, counties, housing agencies, public health agencies, community-based organizations (CBOs), and new and existing ECM and Community Supports providers
 - Participate in planning, as applicable
 - Supply data or statistics
 - Contribute to the application process
 - Coordinate with the Third-Party Administrator (TPA) on funding requests, as applicable
- Opportunity to provide an overview and share the information on the potential processes and timelines





Round 1.

Planning

- Small planning grants to correctional agencies
- Supports collaborative planning with county departments of social services and other enrollment implementation partners
- Outcome: identify and scope out the processes, protocols and IT system modifications needed to implement or modify pre-release Medi-Cal enrollment and suspension services

Open application period April-June 2022

Round 2.

Implementation

 Larger grants to support entities as they implement the processes, protocols and IT system modifications identified in Round 1



 - Commitment to contract with Manage Care Plans (MCPs) to deliver ECM and/or Community Supports

Application process and funding anticipated to begin in Q3 2022

TPA



- Rolling basis review
- Support entities in selecting the right TA services/vendors
- Review for nonduplication with other TA initiatives*
- Identify gaps in regions or applicant types

Applicant



- Select one of the "offthe-shelf" resources or an appropriate vendor registered to provide specialty TA services
- Develop scope of work
 (SOW) with vendor
 including project* and
 deliverables

TPA

- Pay vendor upon completion of the SOW deliverables
- For "off-the-shelf" resources, TPA pays the vendor directly based on agreed rate/ fee schedule



CPI Application Process

Tentative Timing: Q3 2022 to Q2 2025

Invited Entities

- Fill out electronic registration form
- Form will collect:
 - Indicates interest and intent to join a collaborative in their community
 - Entities can operate in more than one region if they operate in multiple regions
- CBOs and underresourced entities will be supported by TPA throughout registration process

Other Entities

Support

 Those not initially invited can still register for participation starting Q3 2022

TPA

- Funding will be used to convene and facilitate collaborative planning groups
- TPA may use funding to hire facilitators if needed
- Individual participants will not receive direct funding from the TPA

Invited Entities

 The needs of local providers/stakeholders will shape planning and implementation activities by region



CITED Application Process

Tentative Timing: Q3 2022 to Q2 2025

1.

Qualified Applicants

- Submit application with a specific funding request indicating how they intend to use PATH CITED funds:
 - Applications describe how requested funding will align with local MCP IPP Needs Assessments and Gap Filling Plans
 - Coordinated with local MCPs and include strategies to avoid duplication and displacement of other funding sources

2.

TPA Review

- Applications reviewed and approved during pre-specified periods. DHCS ultimately determines which applications are approved. Criteria for evaluation may include:
 - How CITED funds will be used
 - MCP coordination and alignment
 - Potential breadth of impact
 - Population that has been historically under-represented or under-served
- TPA will distribute funding following approval of funding by DHCS



Housing and Homelessness Incentive Program (HHIP)



HHIP Overview

- DHCS incentive program available to Medi-Cal MCPs to incentivize investments in the community and progress made in addressing homelessness and keeping people housed
 - Funds to be provided as MCPs meet operational and performance metrics
 - 85% of incentive funds must go to beneficiaries, providers, local Continuum of Care or counties

CalOptima HHIP Goals

- 1. Design and implement a robust street medicine model that provides preventive and urgent care, promoting continuity of care
- 2. Increase Medi-Cal enrollment among individuals experiencing homelessness
- 3. Integrate CalOptima systems with the existing coordinated entry system used for getting individuals into housing by establishing effective data matching and sharing standard operating procedures

Local Homelessness Plan (LHP)

- LHP due to DHCS June 30, 2022
- Must partner with local Continuums of Care, public health, county Behavioral Health, public hospitals, county social services, and local housing departments
- DHCS guidance for LHP:
 - Build off existing local Housing and Urban Development (HUD) or other homeless plans and map existing services
 - Outline how services will be offered, how referrals will be made, how other funding streams will be leveraged or braided and how progress will be tracked toward goals



HHIP Timeline

Based on further review of the payment schedule and in consideration of stakeholder feedback, DHCS adjusted the proposed HHIP program timeline for submission 1 and 2. The measurement period and submission for the LHP remain unchanged.
